2016 was a year of adaptation and development, and placing 2014 concepts into reality. The website since 2014 has matured so that in 2016 it now offers online registration for the reunion, payment of membership fees, a means to contact other members, current and back issues of the SAGA newsletter, the latest news on the website and with the use of Facebook and Twitter to reach out to our members, histories of departments of the college, Agro events and photos and an Empty Saddles section honoring our grads that have passed on. The website is a work in progress and the Facebook and Twitter site has been revitalized (thanks to Louis Bossaer) with attention now being given to sustainability as we move from less development and more maintenance. The hosting of Ag Grad events at Farm Progress Show and Agribition have been great in maintaining contact and selling memberships. Memberships have increased slightly to just over 2000 members. Blair and Ewald have led these initiatives in true Agro style and should be thanked for their commitment to make these new aspects successful. Tanya Napper from the College Development office continues to assist in maintaining our lists and justifying these with those of the Alumni office and College. We look forward to Tanya's extremely capable assistance in the coming year. Maintaining these lists is truly a cooperative effort between SAGA and the College.

At one point we thought we would have to go to the membership for financial help to make these changes. The good news is that your executive has guided this process and helped where they could, adapting and creating projects making any extra help financially unlikely to be needed. The changes themselves are self sustaining.

e) Newsletter – Ewald Lammerding

You will have noted from our Treasurer, Dennis Ewanus', financial report, our 2016 Newsletter costs are down significantly from 2015. Two main reasons for this; hard work, and extra money. The hard work was done by our Membership chair, Vern Racz, and our College Liaison, Tanya Napper. Between them, our hard copy mailing list has been streamlined to just over 800 grads who still like to flip pages when reading about classmates, fellow grads and what SAGA and the College has been up to. Thank you, Vern and Tanya.Our decision to advertise in the Newsletter has made a real dent in our costs to publish. One company, Municipal Hail, has renewed, we are hoping Koch Industries does the same, and a third joined in this Dec., Black Fox Distillery. (Owned and operated by two fellow SAGA members and grads). This influx of funds has considerably offset the continually rising of printing and mailing. Combining the streamlining and advertising, we have reduced the Newsletter costs by almost \$1500. We need to give consideration to how much advertising we would like proceed with. As you have seen from the 2016 issues, we redesigned the back page. It was time anyway, but it was also needed to fit in three advertisers and all the information in 16 pages. Our next step would be to expand from a 16 to a 20 page document. We can only go by 4's, as one more sheet of paper to our format gives us 4 surfaces to use. To print and mail 20 pages would cost approx. \$1400 for 815 newsletters. This cost, of course, could be easily covered by more advertising revenue.

One problem we are having is the lack of contributions from members. The flow of anecdotal information has slowed to a trickle, so there was nothing to put into our old standards, Thundering Herd and Pooped Deck. This is an area of concern. Please send us "stuff" so fellow members can read what you are up to, and what may be happening in your area.

In late 2015, a connection was established with the Records Administrator, University Relations, U of S. This enabled us to publish the names of many more deceased Ag Grads. This influx of new information was beneficial, but it pushed the Newsletter's capacity for even edited obits. Keith Head '67 C, our CPW Liaison, has spent much time and effort to install Empty Saddles on the SAGA Website. It is on that page that members can read the full obituaries of grads that have passed on. Thank you, Keith. Please notify us if you know of a fellow grads passing. We pass this onto University Relations and the AgBio College, resulting in all of us having the same information.

e) Sask. Agricultural Hall of Fame – Bryan Harvey, presented by Louis Bossaer

Two major changes have been put in place at the SAHF this year but the objectives remain the same. The first change is in the corporate structure of the organization. Membership is now open to organizations or individuals with an interest in agriculture with no limits on the numbers of members. A board of directors will be elected from this membership. This removes the constraint of a membership cap of 25 and allows for broad representation from across the spectrum. It also allows for individuals to become members.

The second change is the date of the Award Ceremony and AGM. It will now be held in April of each year instead of the August long weekend. We had received complaints about holding it on the long weekend since many families like to get away that weekend. The April date should be before seeding gets seriously underway and after the return of the snowbirds.

As usual 6 new inductees were named this year there were announced at the Canadian Western Agribition and the remaining three will be announced at Crop Production Week. There are a number of ag grads amongst them.
